Chloë Cooney is the Director of Global Advocacy at Planned Parenthood Federation of America (PPFA). In this capacity, she has launched and now leads PPFA's work to advocate for U.S. leadership on international reproductive health and rights, linking the work in Washington DC to the advocacy PPFA supports in Africa and Latin America. Accomplishments at PPFA have included growing grassroots support for international reproductive health, creating a youth leadership program, leading numerous legislative campaigns to protect and promote reproductive rights, and successfully advocating for U.S. funding for international family planning programs amidst unprecedented opposition in Congress to women's health.

Chloë came to PPFA with wide-ranging expertise in global health policy and advocacy. She specializes in designing and executing advocacy strategies targeting U.S. and international policy makers, including the White House, Congress, key Government agencies, U.S. Presidential candidates, multilaterals, and other donor nations. Notable achievements included launching the Malaria Policy Center; the Congressional Malaria and Neglected Tropical Diseases Caucus; and growing the Global Network for Neglected Tropical Diseases, for which she designed and co-authored its successful \$34 million grant, awarded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. Prior to Endeavor, Chloë worked at the Global Business Coalition on HIV/AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria (GBC), where she managed the executive office and activities of the Board of Directors.

Chloë began her career in the film industry where she managed operations and developed new projects for Peirce Pictures, the production company of filmmaker Kimberly Peirce (Boys Don't Cry, Stop Loss) in New York and Los Angeles. Chloë graduated Summa Cum Laude from Barnard College, Columbia University and was awarded a year-long leadership fellowship with New York University's Wagner School of Public Service and she has served on the Board of Directors for Reel Affirmations, the Nation's LGBT Film Festival. While at Barnard, Chloë was co-coordinator of Students for Choice.
